

## **Lumley Junior School - Sports Premium 2023-2024**



Our sports premium allowance for **2023-2024** is £16,901.00 (+ carry forward from previous year £3886.70). We aim to use this funding to have a lasting impact on the health and fitness of our children, by promoting healthy lifestyles, improving the teaching of PE, providing opportunities to participate in a range of inter-school leagues and competitions, to offer a range of out of school clubs and create links with local community organisations and sports clubs.
