I can present, speak and listen like an artist. I can paint in the style of a famous artist (Paul Cezanne). I can create a traditional design style. I understand how specific artists composed their paintings (Giorgio Morandi). I can analyse the paintings of the artist Paul Cezanne. I can create a monoprint from observation. I can compose a print from a larger observational drawing. I can transform buildings in a style inspired by the artist Hundertwasser. I can design a building in an architectural style. I can design a monument to symbolise a building in an architectural style.	Photography (lessons 2, 3, 4 and 5) Creating fun and inspirational art using photography, photomontage and drawing methods I can use text and image together to create meaningful and powerful photo posters. I can understand abstract art through photography. I can develop skills in making art through digital processes. I can express ideas about art through messages, graphics, texts and images. I can develop a self-portrait from a photograph and translate it into a drawing. I can replicate the mood and expression of a painting through photography. I have learned about the work of Jenny Holzer and Edvard Munch. I can critically discuss my own and other's work, adapting and improving work as it progresses.

Creating flip and geometric patterns, printing from playdough and mark making

- I can create drawings to represent words and phrases.
- I can work with clay tools.
- I can create a range of mark making techniques.
- I can create patterns using printing techniques.
- I can create prints.
- I can make stamps from geometric shapes to create prints.
- I can create patterns using symmetry and reflection.

Analysing famous artists' works Creating art with messages using cultural art forms

- I can analyse famous artists works.
- I can evaluate and analyse creative work using the language of art, craft and design.
- I can create art with messages using cultural art forms.
- I can improve my control of 2D and 3D materials to suit a purpose.
- I am developing an understanding of colour, line and form.
- I can create a symmetrical, abstract art form.
- I can use symbols to create a meaningful message.
- I can develop ideas for 3D work through sketching, drawing and visualisation in 2D.
- I can use thoughts and feelings to review ideas about my culture.
- I am learning how artists make political statements through their art (Banksy).
- I can form opinions about great artworks and key political events through debate and discussion.

Example theme: Memory Box

- I can use a range of drawing techniques to create personal interpretations of familiar objects and memories.
- I am developing techniques, including control and use of materials.
- I can learn about line and tone through drawing.
